Understanding the underlying causative organisms and the relationship between treatment and outcomes is important. Ophthalmology	1 Oct 7:30- 8:30pm	Will Errington	<p>Shakespeare made famous the expression 'the eyes are the windows to the soul' and sight being a dominant human sense, we need to protect patient's sight when they present with worrying symptoms. Understanding why doctors rank a provisional diagnosis above differential diagnoses is a key lifelong learning skill.
