



RULES AND THEIR OBSERVANCES FOR THE CONDUCT OF RACGP EXAMINATIONS

You must read the Assessment Policies at <http://www.racgp.org.au/assessment/policy> prior to presenting for any examination segment.

You must be in the waiting area for the written examinations at least 10 minutes before the scheduled commencement time, and for the clinical examination, at least 30 minutes before the scheduled commencement time.

You must present primary proof of identity to the Administrator or Supervisor at the commencement of the examination. A primary proof of identity should be current, and be an original document, and include a photograph. Any of the following are accepted forms of proof of identity:

- Australian passport in your name, not expired more than two years
- current overseas passport
- current Australian photo driver's license
- proof of age or identity card issued by an Australian state or territory police force
- current Australian student identity card
- any other Australian entitlement or identity card, issued by the commonwealth or a state or territory government, that carries your photograph

You may bring pens, pencils, erasers, rulers, wallets and small handbags into the examination room. Examination Supervisors may inspect anything that you bring into the examination room. Except for these admissible items, examination supervisors may forbid the admission to the room of any materials that they deem unsuitable.

You must not bring any writing paper, correction tape or correction fluid, notes, books, mobile telephones, computers, calculators or any recording or electronic devices, bags or other personal belongings the invigilator may nominate, into the examination room(s).

The RACGP accepts no responsibility for the loss of your personal property in or around the examination room(s).

You must obey any instruction set out on the cover of any examination paper or answer book.

You must obey any instruction given by an examination supervisor.

You must write using black or blue ink.

Examinations will be conducted in English and you must answer all questions in English.

You will not be re-admitted into the examination room after you have left it unless an examination invigilator supervises you during the whole period of your absence from the examination room.

You must not smoke in any examination room or otherwise disrupt the conduct of the examination.

You must not eat in any examination room without prior approval. You may drink only from clear, colourless receptacles.

You must leave all examination papers, question books, answer books and any paper on which you have written notes in the examination room after completing the examination.

You must not leave the examination room during the first 30 minutes or the last 15 minutes of the examination.

You must not communicate with or provide assistance to any other candidate during the examination.

You must not look at another candidate's examination paper for any purpose

You must not accept assistance from any other candidate during the examination.

You must not permit any other candidate to read or copy from your examination book.

You must not disturb any other candidate during the examination at any time.
