#### Overview

The Clinical Emergency Management Program (CEMP) Intermediate workshops have been designed to build participants' knowledge, skills and confidence when responding to medical emergencies. This workshop includes CPR practice and assessment, which meets the 2011–2013 triennium basic CPR course requirement. These workshops are facilitated by a national team of highly trained intensive care paramedics.

This workshop meets the basic life support (BLS) and advanced life support (ALS) training requirement for general practice registrars.

The program consists of the following components:

No.	Component	Estimated time to complete	Due date for completion
1	Online predisposing activity	30 minutes	Must be completed 3 working days prior to the workshop date
2	Online accredited basic activity	90 minutes	Must be completed 3 working days prior to the workshop date
3	Interactive hands-on face-to-face workshop	1 full day (8.30 am to 5.00 pm)	
4	Online reinforcing activity	30 minutes	Will be available 5 working days after the workshop and must be completed within 4 weeks of the workshop date



Each of the course components must be completed to receive 40 Category 1 points in the RACGP QI&CPD Program and to meet the 2011–2013 triennium basic CPR course requirement.

CPR certification is valid for the 2011–2013 RACGP-QI&CPD Program triennium. However the Australian Resuscitation Council Guidelines recommend that those trained in CPR should refresh their skills at least annually.

#### Content

- CPR practice and assessment, including defibrillation
- New Australian Resuscitation Council guidelines – resuscitation and pharmacology
- Basic life support and advanced life support
- Airway management skills
- Anaphylaxis and acute asthma
- Cardiac arrests
- Ventricular fibrillation, primary asystole and asystole
- Acute coronary syndrome
- Psychiatric episodes
- Early management of trauma
- Acute pain management and analgesia
- Collapse and loss of consciousness
- Patient assessment and management
- Emergency crisis scene safety and management.

#### Learning outcomes

At the completion of this workshop you will be able to:

- Demonstrate an understanding of the current Australian Resuscitation Council (ARC) Guidelines.
- Demonstrate airway management skills including competent use of bag valve mask.
- Recognise when PBS emergency drug (Doctor's bag) items may be used.
- Apply cardiopulmonary assessment and resuscitation skills, including defibrillation.
- Understand the importance of effective decision making skills in an emergency situation including team management and delegation of tasks.
- Recognise the need for rapid defibrillation in witnessed cardiac arrest.
- Identify potential neck injury and use a shirt collar to stabilise a patient's neck.

#### Designed for

### Training grants

The Rural Procedural Grants Program provides financial support to maintain and enhance the clinical skills of GPs and locums who deliver:

- unsupervised anaesthetics, obstetrics and / or surgery in ACGC-RA 1\*-5 locations (1\* dependent on additional approval)
- unsupervised emergency medicine in 24-hour triaging Accident and Emergency facilities located in ASGC-RA 2-5 locations.

This financial support is offered as a grant of \$2000 per day for up to 10 days of training per financial year for procedural GPs and for up to 3 days of training per financial year for GPs providing hospital based emergency services.

GPs who attend a CEMP workshop may be eligible for a training grant but they must be registered in the grants program prior to attending the workshop. - General practitioners who repeat the same Category 1 activity in the current triennium will only be awarded Category 1 QI&CPD points for their first attendance at a particular activity.

- General practice registrars requiring a certificate in competency in the management of trauma and Advanced Life Support, must tick the appropriate box on this registration form. Participants who meet the required standard will be provided with a Certificate of Completion at the conclusion of the workshop
- In order to be eligible to participate in this workshop, IMGs will need to have applied for, or completed assessment of, their overseas GP experience by RACGP censors, and one of the following: – have passed the AMC examination (written and clinical) or equivalent
- be enrolled in the RACGP specialist pathway
- be undertaking general practice/or general practice training
