What complication has occurred?


Question 2

Answer 1

A benign mucosal or submucosal lesion such as fibroepithelial polyp or papilloma.

Answer 2

A benign mucosal or submucosal lesion such as neurofibroma, lymphangioma, or granular cell myoblastoma. A malignant tumour such squamous cell/epidermoid carcinoma (most common malignancy found in the oral cavity), verrucous carcinoma.

Answer 3

Total excisional biopsy and pathology examination.
