Do patients visit you with eye conditions? Would you like some guidance on how to identify and manage them appropriately?

Identification and appropriate management of acute eye injuries, infection and progressive vision loss are essential skills for GPs. This workshop will cover a number of ocular conditions commonly presented in general practice.

Squints in children

Strabismus (squinting) is a common disorder that can cause psychosocial distress and permanent functional disability in children. Dr Susie Luu will provide skills for early diagnosis to maximise visual rehabilitation and reduce the risk of amblyopia.

Glaucoma

Glaucoma is a principal cause of visual impairment in the elderly and is the third leading cause of blindness in the world. Assoc Prof John Landers will help you to identify patients at risk of glaucoma, manage the condition and respond to acute changes.

Red eye assessment

The painful red eye may be due to an easily treatable condition such as conjunctivitis, or due to uveitis, the most common inflammatory eye condition causing significant visual impairment. Assoc Prof John Landers will discuss how to assess the seriousness of the presentation and how to treat foreign bodies.

Ocular emergencies and injuries

Ocular emergencies may include penetrating injuries, non-penetrating injuries, chemical burns, orbital cellulitis and retinal detachment. Dr Tim Greenwell will provide information on correct recognition and assessment, initial management and referral.
