Through case study discussion, collaboration and reflection, you will build your confidence in assessing, diagnosing, managing and referring mental health presentations.

Cases discussed include:

- anxiety disorder
- adolescent anger/violence
- withdrawn child
- schizophrenia
- borderline personality disorder
- depression in the elderly
