ABOUT THIS STUDY

The team needs your help to recruit GP registrars and supervisors across Australia in both the AGPT and FSP pathways.

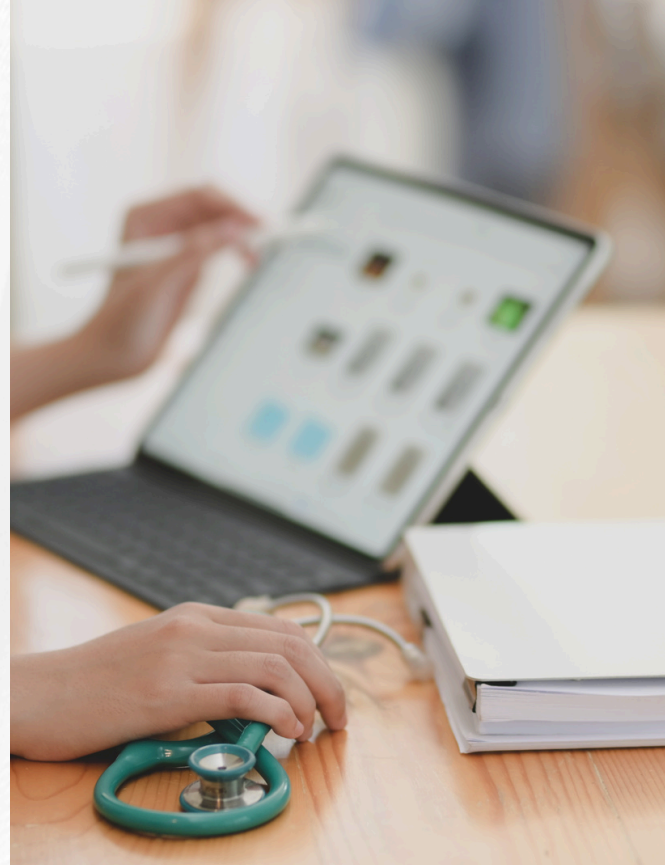
WHAT WILL PARTICIPANTS DO?

Current GP registrars and accredited supervisors will be invited to undertake a **1-hr zoom interview** conducted by ANU medical students. Interviews will involve a hypothetical, progressive telehealth case-study that will highlight potential safety and quality issues and how GPs choose to manage them via telehealth
