

Practice Experience Program (PEP) Standard Stream application information



To give your application the best chance of being accepted, please ensure you supply all the information we need to get you started in the Practice Experience Program (PEP).

Information on any documentation you might be required to provide, based on your personal circumstances, is provided below.

Medical registration

- You appear on the [Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency \(AHPRA\) register of practitioners](#).
- You have no restrictions affecting your scope of practice.

Documents that may be required:

- Copy of your medical registration.
- Copy of any conditions, notations and/or supervision requirements.
- Letter from your employer confirming they are aware of your conditions, notations or supervision requirements, and that you are able to undertake comprehensive general practice.
- Confirmation you have started the process to update your approved sites with AHPRA.

Job in general practice

- Your placement must meet the [General Practice Fellowship Program Placement Guidelines](#).
- You will work at least 14.5 hours per week over a minimum of two sessions in clinical general practice during the PEP.
- Your job is in comprehensive Australian general practice, as defined by the RACGP [Assessment of General Practice Experience Policy](#).

- You will be working in a [Modified Monash Model \(MMM\) 2-7 location](#), or you have a current, valid 3GA provider number that will allow you to remain working in your current placement location.
- You will be able to start the proposed job by the beginning of the PEP term.
- You will be able to stay in the proposed job for at least six months after the PEP term start date.
- If you are subject to the 10-year moratorium, your proposed placement allows you to meet this.

Documents that may be required:

- Medicare-approved placement outcome (APO).
- A recent (within the past 3 months) 3GA history report, available from 19aa@health.gov.au, for anyone participating in, or has participated in, a 3GA program.
- Any Medicare Provider Number extensions you have applied for.
- Proof your practice was located in a Distribution Priority Area when you commenced contract negotiations.
- Your moratorium scaling, if you are subject to the 10-year moratorium. This is available through your online Provider Digital Access (PRODA) account.

Right to work in Australia

- You are either an Australian or New Zealand citizen, temporary or permanent resident.

Assessed general practice experience

It is not a requirement to have your General Practice Experience (GPE) assessed; however, having a GPE assessment will help to determine your time on the program.
