



General practice provides person centered, continuing, comprehensive and coordinated whole person health care to individuals and families in their communities. The Royal Australian College of General Practitioners (RACGP) is responsible for maintaining standards for quality clinical practice, education and training, and research in Australian general practice. The RACGP has the largest general practitioner membership of any medical organisation in Australia.

The RACGP SA&NT has established an annual student 'Prize for General Practice'. The Prize will be awarded to a University of Adelaide and Flinders University recipient. The prize is presented at graduation, with each winner receiving \$500.

Final year students are invited to nominate for the RACGP Prize for General Practice.

General Practice fosters health, wellbeing and resilience through the continuing patient-doctor relationship. As a general specialist, a career in General Practice will be challenging, spanning prevention, health promotion, early intervention and the management of acute, chronic and complex condition. It also offers a flexible environment to performing these roles with a broad cross section of the community involving the home, practice, health service, outreach clinic or hospital.

To apply for the RACGP Prize for General Practice, students will need to self-nominate by seeking feedback from their supervisor in their GP attachment (please see page 2). Applications will be ranked with a weighting of 50% based on academic merit (results in final* assessment or exam), and 50% on feedback from the GP supervisor. The feedback will assess the student's commitment to general practice, employability, communication and knowledge skills.

* Final assessment: end of third year, one submission per student
