Case Conferences in local schools

Just kept going

2014-2019 Telehealth Project Royal Far West Children's Scheme

2018 Nominated by RACGP to GDG



ADHD in Woolgoolga in 2022

Referrals from various sources(GP's, Teachers, AHW's, Paediatricians,...)

Private Billing for majority of patients

Practice Nurse(Ebony) screens enquiries

GP Registrar or PEP Doctor for initial visit

Questionnaires, School Reports, Letters, etc sourced

Access to EMR requested

Initial JWK review 45 mins(Level D)

Trial of Stimulants arranged if parents/carers give informed consent

Adult Patients referred to suitable Psychiatrist if stimulants indicated

Case Conference 1 high school Coffs Harbour each term

Non attendance is a major issue

ADHD: Myths and Misconceptions

Does ADHD really exist?

Don't they grow out of it?

Isn't it just a "boy thing"?

Isn't everyone forgetful or inattentive or impulsive some of the time?

Don't they just need firm boundaries?

Aren't Stimulants addictive?

Aren't they just "bad children"?

Isn't is due to "poor parenting"?



ADHD: Practice Tips

- Children underachieving against their potential should be thoroughly assessed
- "Screens" addiction
- If the parent/carer is concerned about the child, you must address those concerns
- Teachers know more about their pupils in primary school than you do
- Get them into sport or some form of regular physical activity
- Ask the Parents/Carers what they think is going on. They are often right!

ADHD Take Home Messages

1.5 million Australians have ADHD

1/4 approx. are diagnosed and treated

½ do not require medication(but a diagnosis wouldn't hurt!)

Let's look out for the "missing quarter"
