of members believe it's important for the RACGP to advocate strongly on behalf of GPs. Our work in this space has secured significant workforce and payroll tax wins, and new investment in Medicare. We will continue to push for increased rebates for longer consultations alongside other priorities in the RACGP's 2024-25 Advocacy Plan.

Your regional and national faculties provide dedicated support to more than 50,000 members across key areas of general practice, including 4000 of you who became new Fellows in 2024.

The fully funded RACGP Future Leaders Program has already armed more than 150 Fellows with the skills and experience necessary to influence and achieve change, with many more graduates in the pipeline.

The RACGP Board approved the fourth edition of the Standards for general practice training, setting the requirements for training programs to deliver safe, high-quality training that prepares registrars for Fellowship.

The average CPD recorded by GPs in myCPD was more than 73 hours in 2024, demonstrating how proactively you embrace lifelong learning, embed it into your daily work, and adapt to the new CPD requirements.

additional placements

You have told us attracting the next generation of GPs to the profession is of high importance and to support this we have secured Commonwealth funding for 2000 additional GP trainee placements by 2028, bolstering the future of general practice.

The Australian Journal of General Practice (AJGP) continues to improve inclusion, engagement, and build its reputation, growing readership and encouraging participation. We will be increasing its digital presence in

We secured crucial legislative changes and commitments exempting GPs from retrospective payroll tax in NSW, Vic, SA, Qld and ACT.

In response to registrar feedback, we've improved the Key Feature Problem (KFP) exam structure by removing handwritten responses. This change enhances accessibility for all candidates and ensures results are available ahead of the Clinical Competency Exam (CCE) enrolment.




Over 4400 doctors started GP training in Term 1, 2025, with 53% based in regional, rural and remote areas (MM2-7). College-led training is lifting care where needed most, with 91% registrar satisfaction in 2024.

The RACGP's myCPD app has now achieved 33,633 downloads. Our CPD provider network continues to grow, delivering close to 5000 high-quality, relevant CPD activities to members.

We have also continued to deliver on our AMC obligations, undertaking quality assurance and integrity checks of CPD activities.

RACGP publications and media

In 2024, RACGP media put general practice in the spotlight. 10,000 unique stories were published, 664 million reached, demonstrating one powerful voice for our members.

Our flagship Australian Journal of General Practice delivers timely, peer-reviewed insights to over 36,000 GPs. During the past year we have seen an increase in GP contributions to AJGP.

Our check publication offers practical and relevant case based learning on key clinical conditions.

RACGP conferences and events

Each year, the RACGP hosts two flagship events — the GP Conference and the Practice Owners Conference — alongside more than 80 workshops and local events. These events provide valuable opportunities for members to connect with peers, engage with their professional community, and fulfil their CPD requirements
