

Selection Criteria for REC Chairs 2021-2024

- Strong professional networks and linkages across the health sector especially within the REC's area of responsibility
- 2. Well informed of national and international developments in general practice within the REC's area of responsibility
- 3. Ability to research and analyse international trends in general practice
- 4. Specific experience and expertise within the various aspects of the REC's responsibility
- 5. Ability to lead and provide expertise to the development of RACGP position statements, submissions, guidelines, resources and other tools aimed at supporting the profession
- 6. Capacity to commit to the REC for the required duration and expected participation time over the three-year term, including provision of advice and comment on position and consultation documents
- 7. Ability to represent the RACGP at various fora and meetings within the REC Chair's area of expertise
- 8. Experience and ability to work in a multidisciplinary group/committee through building collaboration
- 9. Current financial member of RACGP

When submitting an application:

- Please outline years of membership and contribution on a current or previous RACGP Expert Committee, National Standing Committee, Faculty Board, other RACGP Committees and working groups, and/or as an RACGP Representative to an external organisation
- Outline why you are an appropriate person for the role
- Provide three priorities for the direction you intend to take the committee
