## New respiratory clinics to reduce pressure on hospitals

### In October 2021, the Victorian Government announced funding for:

- ▶ 20 additional GP respiratory clinics to open in priority LGAs in metropolitan Melbourne
- existing GP respiratory clinics in areas with high COVID-19 caseloads to extend their operating hours to include after-hours operations
- New GP respiratory clinics are being commissioned by Primary Health Networks

### The clinics will:

- Supports increased local access to respiratory assessments and immediate care for people of all ages.
- Provides GPs with a referral option for patients who require face to face respiratory assessments if their practice is unable to do so.
- Expands primary care access for people with low acuity respiratory symptom by providing an alternative pathway for care other than an emergency department.

# New state-funded GP respiratory clinics




### **Key features of clinics**

- Supports people of all ages (including children) with low acuity respiratory symptoms
- Respiratory assessments offered, including testing for COVID-19
- Open extended hours after hours and on weekends
- Staffed by GPs and nurses
- Located in priority LGAs with high caseloads and high respiratory presentations to ED
- Available to those with or without a Medicare card, at no cost to the patient
- Services accessible via **pre-booked appointment** (phone or online booking system) and 'walk up'

# GP respiratory clinics – patient pathway

- Provides GPs with a referral option for patients who require face to face respiratory assessments and immediate care support, if a practice is unable to provide this
- ▶ **GP to GP referral** patients referred back to existing GP following episode of care at respiratory clinic, or supported to **engage with a new GP** if they don't have one
- Patients may **self-refer** to clinics, or be **advised/supported to access services through existing services**, e.g. Nurse on Call, general practices, Ambulance Victoria, hospitals
- ▶ Patients who test positive for COVID-19 will be supported to access the COVID Positive Pathway Program



## Extending operating hours of existing GP respiratory clinics

- ► There are 28 existing Commonwealth-funded GP respiratory clinics across the state including 18 in regional Victoria
- Grants will be available to support these clinics to extend their operating hours to include evenings and weekends
- Clinics must be offering full respiratory assessments to be eligible
- A grants process will be run by the Victorian Department of Health in December 2021/January 2022, with extended operating hours expected from early 2022

### **Commissioning process**

- Standing up of new clinics partnership between the Victorian Department of Health and Primary Health Networks (PHNs)
- Clinics are being commissioned through the metropolitan Melbourne based PHNs – North Western Melbourne PHN, Eastern Melbourne PHN and South Eastern Melbourne PHN
- An EOI process was run, with 33 submissions received
- Clinics will progressively open from December 2021 and run for seven months

### Resources and support

- ✓ An advisory group, with representation from existing GP respiratory clinics, RACGP Victorian Faculty and PHNs, is advising on the roll out of the new clinics.
- ✓ The group is supporting the development of a suite of resources and support material for the new GP respiratory clinics, in the areas of;
  - Infection prevention and control
  - ✓ Training and support
  - ✓ Workforce configuration/staffing profile
  - Patient flow
  - Promotion of the clinics
- ✓ These resources will be broadly accessible, and will contribute to supporting the delivery of safe respiratory care in general practice settings

Keep vigilant, even in a vaccinated population, screening, testing and public health measures still apply

# Impact and promotion of GP respiratory clinics



### Impact of clinics

- PHNs will collect data to monitor performance and evaluate impact
- In addition to standard demographic data, responses will be sought from patients that will enable an assessment of whether clinics are achieving objectives, i.e.,
  - How did you hear about the clinic?
  - Do you have a regular GP?
  - Where would you have gone if you has not come here?
- Other measures are being considered that will enable a broader assessment of patient and systems impacts



### **Promotion of clinics**

- The department and PHNs will work to promote community and sector awareness of the GP respiratory clinics
- Community members will receive clear information on the purpose of the clinics within the broader COVID-19 sector response.
- Targeted promotion and engagement will be undertaken to ensure priority populations (e.g. culturally and linguistically diverse populations) are reached
- Individual GP respiratory clinics may also undertake their own promotion and engagement
