- Implementation of the Australian Government's COVID-19 vaccination program started in Victoria on 22 February 2021. - This program commences with the priority groups in phase 1a of the national vaccine rollout. - There is significant demand for COVID-19 vaccines to help end the COVID-19 pandemic and this means initial doses available must be allocated to priority groups at greatest risk of COVID-19 infection and serious illness.
- Doses of COVID-19 vaccine are currently limited but as more doses become available, more people will be vaccinated. The Australian Government has established phases of vaccine rollout that are based on ages and other risk factors including existing medical conditions.

- People who are in the priority groups in phase 1a will receive an invitation to register for their COVID-19 vaccination. All people in phase 1a are our priority, and you will be vaccinated in due course – thank you for being patient as we get into a steady rhythm rolling out vaccines safely and effectively.
- The new Victorian COVID-19 Vaccine Control Centre (VVCC) was established on 22 February 2021 in parallel with an Alert Advisory Group to monitor the safety of the COVID-19 vaccines. This is a collaboration between the Australian and Victorian Governments and our partners.
- The VVCC is a central coordination point for vaccination hubs, Australian Government Vaccine Operations Centre, the Victorian Department of Health and Surveillance of Adverse Events Following Vaccination in the Community (SAEFVIC) to ensure rapid respond to any events in the COVID-19 vaccination rollout.
- People who have received the COVID-19 vaccine are encouraged to report any possible adverse reactions following vaccination by responding to the SMS they receive after the vaccine or by contacting the [Victorian SAEFVIC Line](https://www.aefican.org.au/Home/Info/VIC) <<https://www.aefican.org.au/Home/Info/VIC>>.
- As with all vaccines, the COVID-19 vaccines will be continuously monitored for safety by the Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) – who oversee the safety of vaccines across Australia.
- For general enquiries call the Coronavirus hotline on **1800 675 398** 24 hours, open seven days a week and select option 3 for COVID-19 vaccines.

Delivery of COVID-19 vaccines

Priority groups

Australia's COVID-19 vaccines will be available in phases, as defined by the [Australian Government's schedule](https://www.health.gov.au/initiatives-and-programs/covid-19-vaccines/getting-vaccinated-for-covid-19/who-will-get-the-vaccines) <https://www.health.gov.au/initiatives-and-programs/covid-19-vaccines/getting-vaccinated-for-covid-19/who-will-get-the-vaccines>, with groups prioritised based on expert medical and public health advice.

Vaccine hubs

Victorians at greatest risk of COVID-19 will initially be able to receive the COVID-19 vaccine at Victorian public hospital vaccination hubs. The first Pfizer immunisations started on 22 February 2021, at Austin Health, Barwon Health, Monash Health (in partnership with Alfred Health) and Western Health.

The Australian Government has stated that general practices will be prioritised for participation during the early stages of the phase 1b rollout, based on capacity, readiness and geographical spread. The Victorian Department of Health (the department) is committed to working with the Australian Government and Victorian general practices in this important work and awaits further details on the location of initial practices that will participate and the anticipated vaccinations they will be able to deliver.

Equitable and easy access to COVID-19 vaccines will be essential, and the Department recognises the important role general practitioners will play in protecting their local communities through their participation in the Australian Government's COVID-19 vaccination program.

Vaccination site preparedness (new)

Looking after patients after they have received a COVID-19 vaccine (new)

A number of treatment options can reduce the side effects of the vaccine including:

- Give extra fluids to drink.
- Put a cold wet cloth on the injection site to ease discomfort.

Although routine use of paracetamol after vaccination is not recommended, if fever or pain at the injection site is present, paracetamol can be given. Encourage patients to check the label for the correct dose or speak with their pharmacist. Patients should also be advised to see their GP (doctor) if a reaction following immunisation is unexpected, persistent or severe, or if they are worried. Legal authorisation of workforce and training

The 'emergency authorised workforce' (staff who do not usually deliver immunisations) refers to newly authorised workforce – who are not currently authorised immunisers and not frequently providing vaccines. The department has partnered with [Torrens Health](https://www.torrenshealth.com.au) <https://www.torrenshealth.com.au> to assist with workforce surge requirements.

All COVID-19 vaccine providers, including existing authorised immunisers, will need to undertake training specific to the COVID-19 vaccines. Any additional authorised surge workforce for COVID-19 vaccines will require additional training to assist with the rollout. **A summary of the training requirements is in Appendix I.**
