What is the treatment?



Answer 1

Poppy seeds have been placed under surgical tape by a doctor in Vietnam so as to allow self stimulation of acupressure points in an attempt to relieve symptoms of osteoarthrits.

Answer 2

The seeds resemble fungal spores such as those seen in otitis externa caused by species of aspergillus, a reasonable diagnosis given the history of travel. It is easily discounted, however, by simple questioning.

Answer 3

The patient's symptoms were due to impacted ear wax.
