What is the most likely diagnosis?


Question 2

Answer 1

Halo naevus (Sutton's naevus – leukoderma centrifugum acquisitum).

Answer 2

- the development of halo around preexisting naevus, and
- · the disappearance of naevus.

Answer 3

None. Observe and evaluate the naevus for clinical criteria for malignancy (variation of pigment and irregular borders) as a halo may occasionally develop around a primary malignant melanoma.
