Your Team

The appointee to this role will become a member of the Council of Censors (CoC), and an *ex officio* member of the RACGP NSW/ACT State Faculty Council.

The Education Business Unit plays a critical role in ensuring that the RACGP has the right mechanisms to support, review and maintain standards for all aspects of a GP's training and education across the lifelong journey of General Practice. In maintaining these standards, Education teams develop and deliver Fellowship examinations, set and apply eligibility, selection and entry criteria for Fellowship pathways, and implement the RACGP's strategic vision.

Your Role

The role of a Censor is an important one in maintaining the standards, fairness and integrity of the RACGP Fellowship program.

Censors play a vital role in the RACGP by supporting all general practitioners in training as they progress to Fellowship.

Censors make determinations and provide advice on matters pertaining to the RACGP Fellowship and provide recommendations on the suitability of candidates for admission to Fellowship of the RACGP.

Key Responsibilities

This statement of duties notes the ongoing requirements of the role and does not reference nor identify areas of work that are irregular to this employment relationship.

- Attend designated meetings.
- Review documentation and provision of feedback and recommendations verbally or in writing (policy, guidelines).
- As a member of the CoC, contribute to discussions on ratification of exam results and determination of exam incidents.
- Liaise with local state training organisations, relevant stakeholder groups, and represent the RACGP at state-based meetings, as required, to support the State Faculty Chair and State Manager e.g.. Parliamentary Hearings, Department of Health Forums or PHN meetings.
- Assess readiness to commence terms in general practice, Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL), and Completion of Training. Assess applications for Fellowship for all RACGP Fellowship pathways, and submit these applications for ratification.
- Respond to Training Organisations or GP in training questions about implementation or any variation to training standards and policy including but not limited to extended skills, overseas posts, mandatory terms, and ADF requirements.
- Contribute to the development of the Public Report for each exam. Contribute to the development of exam candidate support material.
- Be the spokesperson for the State Faculty on all assessment-related issues; and represent the CoC to the State Faculty. Provide CoC representation on the RACGP NSW/ACT State Faculty activities (as appropriate), such as deputise at fellowship ceremonies, provide reports for Faculty Council, and contribute to Faculty Council discussions.
- Provide faculty-based quality assurance of assessment workshops and assessment delivery, with an emphasis on maintaining national standards and processes. Assessment workshops include any workshops aimed at exam support and preparation - KFP, AKT, Clinical exam workshops and webinars.
- Provide Quality Assurance input and oversight for the RACGP assessments.
- Assist with conjoint exams including oversight of assessment development and delivery, and attendance at exams as requested by the CiC.
- Participate in the RACGP Performance Review cycle conducted by the National Clinical Lead – Assessment Operations and Education Governance. Deliver agreed Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) to be developed in conjunction with the National Clinical Lead – Assessment Operations and Education Governance, State Manager, NSW/ACT Faculty and Censor-in-Chief.
- Undertake other duties that may arise from time to time as directed by the Censor-in-Chief or State Manager, NSW/ACT Faculty.

- Comply with all relevant workplace policies and procedures.
- Other duties as required
