Together PLT Program Management and Medical Educators will build a supportive culture and enable teams to work to the top of their scope.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health Medical Educators are responsible for assisting in the delivery of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultural and health training at all levels of RACGP training – National, Regional and Local. They support the National Clinical Lead Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health training in ensuring that the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultural and health training curriculum and program is delivered to a high quality. They support the building and maintenance of the training pipeline to enable Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people to undertake and complete training for RACGP fellowship. They also oversee the building and maintenance of the training pipelines to work within Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health services.

An important component of the work of the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander medical educator is to support regional and local training teams in delivering Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultural and health training. They work closely with Cultural Educators and Cultural Mentors to deliver a cohesive program.
