The Northern Territory Placement Support Grants offer an incredible opportunity to gain first-hand experience in rural and remote medicine. By working in the NT, you can have unique placements, work closely with diverse populations, and make a meaningful impact on underserved communities.

Choosing to do all, or even part, of your training in a rural or remote setting offers numerous benefits:

- make a real difference to a community, even if it is for a short time
- build and broaden your skills and expertise in key clinical areas
- benefit from being part of a collegiate team of doctors, nurses and Aboriginal Health Practitioners
- enjoy being part of a smaller community and the perks of the NT lifestyle

Placement Support Grants

Who can apply?

- 1. Interstate Registrars:** Transfer to the Northern Territory for at least 6 months and receive up to \$10,000. In addition, if you choose to do your 6-month placement in an MMM6-7 location, you can earn an additional \$5,000 (up to \$15,000 in total).
- 2. Northern Territory Registrars:** Move from MMM2 to MMM6-7 locations for a 6 month placement and receive \$5,000.
- 3. NT Composite Registrars:** Commit to a placement in an MMM6-7 location for your rural rotation in the Northern Territory and receive \$10,000.

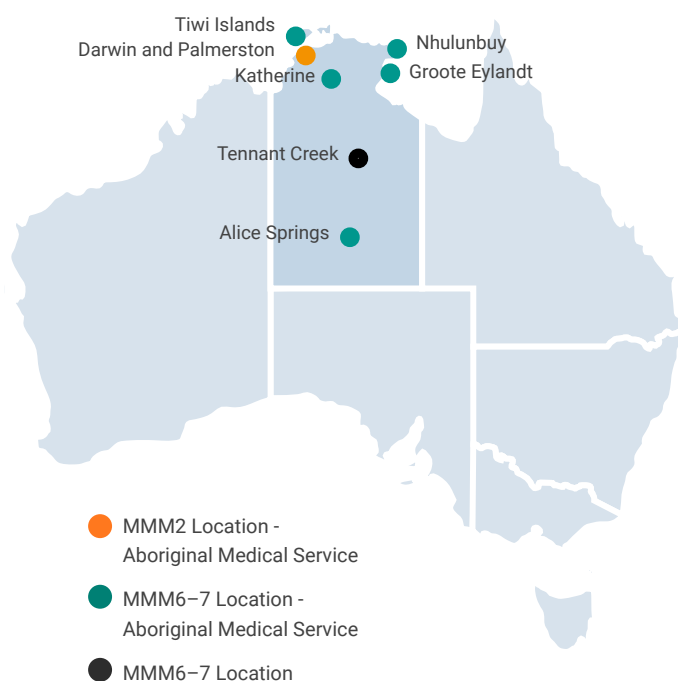
