#### Successful research grant application

MUDRI in partnership with the Fire to Flourish program, was recently successful in receiving a NRRA grant to undertake a two-year study entitled, '*Internally displaced people: 2019-20 Bushfires, an iterative analysis*'. Our team is currently developed the basis for this study and we will provide further advice and seek consultations and collaborations at the right time.

### Gender and Disaster Australia (GADAus)

The former Gender in Disaster Pod, an initiative of Women's Health In the North, Women's Health Goulburn North East and MUDRI, now in its 13<sup>th</sup> year, recently changed its name to Gender and Disaster Australia (GADAus). Under the leadership of Dr Debra Parkinson and her team at GADAus, Gender in Disaster continues to grow strongly and now provides training and consultancies nationally. ### Three recent influential reports

The Victorian Inspector General for Emergency Management has released the second report following the 2019/20 bushfires. This thoughtful and insightful Repot highlights the 'community voice' through several individual case studies. Lessons to be Learned in Relation to the Australian Bushfire Season 2019-20 - Final Report, December 2021. Senate Finance and Public Administration References Committee. Available <u>here</u>. This is the last of the reports from the inquiries and reviews following the 2019/20 national bushfires and raises some insights additional to those of the earlier Royal Commission's Report.

### Second National Action Plan in support of the National Disaster Risk Reduction Framework

The National Recovery and Resilience Agency (NRRA) leads a national process to develop the Second National Action Plan in support of the National Disaster Risk Reduction Framework (NDRRF). The Australian Institute Disaster Resilience (AIDR) hosted a national webinar on 4 April, 2022, during which the NRRA outlined the extensive consultation process being undertaken to engage with all stakeholders and ensure a collaborative and consultative approach. This process includes a discussion paper and call for submissions, to be announced in coming weeks, a national survey, and a National Summit scheduled for the end of June 2022.
