The RACGP delivers the Profession-Led, Community-Based Training Program (PLT) which is the specialist training program to train medical doctors in general practice as a key component of the Department of Health's Australian General Practice Training (AGPT) Program.

Your Role

The Medical Education team and PLT Program Management will work collaboratively to achieve the best outcomes for registrars and supervisors ensuring the delivery of a high-quality nationally consistent GP training program. Together PLT Program Management and Medical Educators will build a supportive culture and enable teams to work to the top of their scope.

The National Clinical Lead Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health training is responsible for national oversight of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health Training. They ensure that there is a nationally consistent approach to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultural and health training and that high quality training is provided. They are responsible for overseeing the building and maintenance of the training pipeline to enable Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people to undertake and complete training for RACGP fellowship. They also oversee the building and maintenance of training pipelines to work within Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health services.
