Your Team

The RACGP is currently undertaking a complex transition program to establish its new Profession-Led, Community-Based Training (PLT) capability to train medical doctors in General Practice as a key component of the Department of Health's Australian General Practice Training (AGPT) Program. The PLT transition is a fundamental change to the delivery of GP training in Australia, providing an opportunity to improve the quality, safety and accessibility of GP services for all Australians. This transition will build new capabilities from the ground up as well as transfer capabilities from the existing Regional Training Organisations that currently provide AGPT training services. A growing team is in the process of defining, planning and implementing this business transformation program, with a range of inter-related projects in-flight or being established.

Your Role

To support transition activities, we are seeking a senior Medical Educator for a fixed term contract to March 2023 to utilise their subject matter expertise in developing select components of the RACGP PLT Education Program: induction and orientation, hospital term registrar support and education, and readiness for GP placement assessments and RPL assessments.

In the development of these components, you will be working closely with the Principal Medical Educator, the Lead Transition Medical Educators, the Education Program Team, wider-RACGP and RTO subject matter experts as required.

The successful candidate will have an excellent understanding of the AGPT training program and application of the RACGP curriculum and syllabus to program delivery. They will have particular expertise in the induction of new registrars to the program, recognition of prior learning assessments, support of registrars doing hospital terms, and preparation of registrars for GP placements. They will have extensive experience in the development of educational activities, excellent written and verbal communication skills and a demonstrated ability to work collaboratively and meet tight timelines.

Key Responsibilities

Under the auspice of the PLT Education Program and with reference to the RACGP's curriculum and syllabus, core education program, and the RTOs' existing programs as shared:

- Lead, with the support of the Program Leads for the Education Program Development project, the development of the Induction and Orientation to PLT Program component of the Education Program
- Lead, with the support of the Program Leads for the Education Program Development project, the development of the hospital term registrar support and education component of the Education Program
- Lead, with the support of the Program Leads for the Education Program Development project, the development of the readiness for GP placement assessments and RPL assessments, processes and procedures for the collation of evidence require to prove GP term readiness
- Work with the Education Program leads to ensure that project timelines are met
- Comply with all relevant workplace policies and procedures
- Other duties as required
