The RACGP delivers the General Practice Training Programs which are specialist training programs to train medical doctors in general practice.

The GP Training Business Unit plays a critical role in ensuring that all communities in Australia have access to welltrained, competent GPs who deliver high quality, innovative care. We do that by having the right mechanisms to support, review and maintain standards for all aspects of a GP's training.

The Training Programs team delivers education and training programs designed to support non-vocationally registered doctors on their pathway to RACGP Fellowship. These programs include the Practice Experience Program (PEP) – Specialist stream (transitioning to the International Specialist Program January 2023), and the Fellowship Support Program (FSP).

Your Role

Reporting to the National Clinical Lead – PEP Specialist, the Medical Educator PEP Specialist role supports assessment, medical education, strategy and remediation functions as part of program delivery. The Medical Educator PEP Specialist ensures that any relevant information is shared across teams to enable the continued smooth operational functioning of GP Training.

Key Responsibilities

- Working with the National Clinical Lead PEP Specialist and the PEP Specialist team, deliver all education and training activities associated with the PEP Specialist training program.
- Medical education:
 - Induction and orientation.
 - o Learning needs assessment and planning.
 - Small group education.
 - o Consultation observation.
 - Case discussion.
 - o Answer questions from members, staff and participants relating to the educational materials.
 - o Revise and update any guides, training material relevant to the learning units.
 - o Participate in the updating and evaluation of learning resources.
- Assessment:
 - o Participate in delivery and evaluation of the Workplace-Based Assessment (WBA) program.
 - Assist in monitoring progress of participants.
 - Assist with training clinical assessors.
- Mentorship and support for participants.
- Program document and resource development and maintenance including:
 - Program handbooks.
 - o Content guides.
 - Assessment guides.
 - Education modules.
- Contribute to remediation and performance management.
- Participate in the evaluation process for training programs.
- Participate in the RACGP Performance Review Cycle.
- In consultation with Manager, deliver agreed Work Performance Goals.
- Other duties as required.
